This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

### Part A: Curriculum music

We are lucky enough to have a dedicated music room. During their time at North, children learn to use a wide range of instruments, such as their voice, the recorder, the glockenspiel, keyboards and Djembe drums. We use a combination of specialist teachers and Charanga to develop the children's knowledge of music. Our curriculum engages and inspires pupils to develop a love of music and their talent as musicians, and so increase their self-confidence, creativity and sense of achievement. As pupils progress, they develop a critical engagement with music, allowing them to compose, and to listen with discrimination to the best in the musical canon.
